Dear praying friends,

It's a good thing that we decided to wait to write this letter, because we have very exciting news that happened in just the past week! On Saturday the 10th, we went door to door for the first time in Biatorbágy!

That was very exciting!!

So far, we did only public evangelizing in the markets and in the big parks and to people on the streets. We have also put up fliers and put literature in mailboxes. In Hungary, things are very different from America. There's very rarely NOT a fence surrounding a home. You ring the bell that's beside the gate and wait for somebody to literally come outside to you. So this is harder to do here, but it is not impossible, and we have a goal to ring every door bell in Biatorbágy by the middle of next year.

Since August, I've occasionally and briefly met with an older man, Ferenc, who kept promising to come to church. He finally did come on Tuesday. He has been haunted by his past and was seeking redemption, and found Jesus on Tuesday! As I was preaching, Ferenc began to cry. He accepted Christ there on the spot! Praise the Lord!

He came with a woman he met in December. Both are widowed. The woman's name is Maria. She comes from a religious background and claims to have called on the name of the Lord, but we are not for sure that she fully understands about salvation. Meeting with her for the first time, she seems like she is not understanding her surroundings, but her memory is very sharp, and there are times that she understands everything perfectly. She was quoting Scripture while I was reading it. Please pray that she will come to the Lord if she has not already.

Both Maria and Ferenc are very excited to start coming to every service from now on! They received Bibles and booklets for new believers. Please pray for me as I disciple Ferenc, and pray that we will find out more about Maria. She speaks English, so that is a blessing for Elisabeth as she can talk with her.

From this month on, we will be in a special news booklet advertising special events and places in Biatorbágy! This booklet is put into every single mailbox every single month! And for free! This is a wonderful blessing and opportunity. We are praying that this will attract people to the church and spread the word.

We are also trying to get into a monthly newspaper. This requires a monthly fee, but it would be wonderful to also advertise ourselves in the newspaper.

We are praying for the three families to come back to our church services. We had discussions with them, and they do not believe that we are preaching the truth because we won't compromise our beliefs. One family is not as hard-hearted, and will come to our church if they see that God really wants them to. We must pray very hard for them.

We would like to once again mention that raising support is critical to our ministry. We have almost a full schedule filled for when we are in America. But we need help even now! Even if we cannot meet with you this year, we promise to visit and present our ministry the next time we will be in America. If you would like to schedule a meeting with us, please contact me or Pastor Paul Pierucki. We need to be in Biatorbágy more and it is not working with my full time secular job tying me and my family down. Thank you for your prayers and your support in this area.

We would also like to clarify that we have been working only with the Pranger family and the Pierucki family while starting the ministry in Biatorbágy. They have been real blessings to us and for the ministry, and we are very thankful for their help and support.

Elisabeth is enjoying teaching English to people from the church in Dunakeszi. It is also helping her understanding of Hungarian. She is creating her own "curriculum" and is doing very well. This will be a wonderful outreach ministry in the future!
