The water heater I had installed just before we left blew up a few weeks ago and flooded the entire building. Not much was damaged. We wanted to redo that eventually anyway, but I guess it will be done sooner than we thought! The giant shipment of John/Romans we had finally gotten from customs also got wet, but as far as we can tell, not many were ruined. I found a good, new water heater online I bought for \$120 – a great deal! That is a need so there will be hot water available, so I had to buy that right away. We must repair the main room as soon as possible. We are thankful that not more than that happened.

We are also thankful for our kind friends and family who helped us in Biatorbágy while we were away! While we were gone, another young lady came to know Christ as her Savior! Pray for her to attend church and grow in the Lord. We plan on meeting with her very soon.
